Many Features, Tips, and Fun Stuff in ... iPhone (iOS 17)

How to Share a Slideshow on a iPhone ...

- 1. On your iPhone, Open the "Photos" App ...
 - Tap "Albums" ...
 - Open the "Album" you want to Turn Into a Slideshow ...
 - <u>Tap</u> the "3-Dots-Circle" at the Top Right ...
 - Tap the "Play Memory Video" ...
 - Tap the "Screen" as the Video is Playing to Bring Up the Menu ...
 - **Press** the "**Pause Button**" to **Pause** the **Video** ...
 - If you're Happy with the Slideshow, Tap the "Share Button" ...
 - To <u>AirDrop</u> the video on the **Same Wi-Fi** as you, <u>**Tap**</u> the **AirDrop Button** ...
 - To <u>Save</u> it as a Video, <u>Tap</u> Save Video, or <u>Send</u> It via Email or Messages.

Use Haptic Touch (Long-Press) to Preview an Email...

- 2. **Open** the **Mail App** ...
 - Long-Press on an Email ...
 - You will see a **Menu** that <u>Allows</u> you to <u>Access</u> most of the "Controls", the First Row is "Reply", "Reply All", and "Forward" ...
 - From here, you can <u>Tap:</u> "Mark", or <u>Tap:</u> "Notify Me", "Mute", "Move Message", "Trash Message" or "Block Sender" ...
 - If you <u>Tap:</u> "Mark" you can then Select F<u>lag</u>, "Mark as Unread," or "Move to Junk".

How to Enable Reader View in Safari on iPhone ...

- 3. Open "Safari" and Navigate to the Page you want to Read...
 - <u>Tap</u> the "AA icon" ...
 - **Tap** "**Show Reader**" (The page will change to Safari's reading mode, eliminating any ads and other stuff.) ...
 - (Note: If Reader is grayed out, it means the page does not work with Safari Reader.)
 - The "AA icon" will now Be Black to <u>Show</u> that "Reader View" is <u>Active</u>. <u>Tap</u> the Icon again to <u>See</u> "More Reader View Options" ...
 - Choose a "Location on your iCloud Account" to Save the "PDF" ...
 - You can then **Change**: **Background Color**, **Font Style**, and **Font Size**.

How to Auto Delete Old Text Messages on iPhone ...

- 4. Open Settings, and Select Messages ...
 - <u>Under</u> "Message History", <u>Tap</u> <u>Keep Messages</u> ...
 - Your "Options" are "30 Days", "1 Year", and "Forever" ...

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- (Note: If you select 30 Days or 1 Year, a warning will pop up telling you that "Enabling this setting will permanently remove all messages older than 30 days or 1 year") ...
- Once you <u>Tap</u> the "Delete Button", all your older messages are premaritally lost.

How to Mass Delete Text Messages on iPhone ...

- 5. Open any Text Conversation in the Messages App ...
 - Long Press on Any Message, then Tap More ...
 - Circles Slide In from the Left Edge of the Screen for Each Message ...
 - Then, **Tap** a **Circle**, and it'll **Turn Blue** with a **Checkmark** in the **Middle** ...
 - Check Off as many Messages as you want Delete ...
 - Tap the Trash Can Icon in the Lower Left ...
 - Tap Delete Message.
 - (Note: Quickly clear up your messages by getting rid of messages you don't need anymore. You can delete individual messages without deleting the whole conversation.)

Scan a Document on iPhone with the Files App ...

- 6. Open the Files App ...
 - Tap the "Three Dot Menu Button" in the "Top Right Corner" ...
 - And Select "Scan Documents" ...
 - <u>Move</u> the "iPhone" <u>Over</u> the <u>Document</u> you want to <u>Scan</u>, once the <u>App Detects a</u> <u>Document</u>, it <u>Automatically Snaps a Photo</u>, you can also <u>Tap</u> the <u>Auto Button</u> in the <u>Upper Right Corner</u> to <u>Manual</u> and then <u>Tap</u> the "Shutter Button" ...
 - If you want to **Keep the Document**, U "Keep Scan".
 - Once you've <u>Scanned</u> All your Document(s), <u>Tap</u> "Save (x)" ...
 - You may need to <u>Choose</u> the <u>Folder</u> where you want to <u>Save</u> your <u>Scanned</u>
 Document. If so, <u>Choose</u> the <u>Folder</u>, and <u>Tap</u> <u>Save</u> in the <u>Top Right Corner</u> ...
 - <u>Tap</u> the icon of the **Document** to <u>See</u> your <u>Scanned Document</u>.

How to Send Balloons (And Stuff) on iPhone ...

- 7. **Open** the **Messages App** ...
 - Start a New Message ...
 - Enter the Name of At Least "One Recipient" ...
 - (Note: If you are <u>Starting</u> a <u>New Message</u> to "<u>Another iPhone User</u>" the "<u>Users Name</u>" will <u>Print in "Blue</u>", which Confirms that the Recipient will be able to see your screen effects. If you selected an existing conversation, <u>Check</u> for <u>Blue Text Message Bubbles</u>, which <u>Confirms</u> the other person can <u>See</u> your <u>iMessage Effects</u>.) ...
 - **Type** your **Text Message** ...
 - Then Long Press the Arrow for at Least One Second ...

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- <u>Tap</u> Top Left of the "<u>Screen</u>" Option at the Top of the Screen to <u>Access</u> "Full-Screen Effects" ...
- <u>Swipe</u> from the **Right Side** of the **Screen** to the **Left** to <u>Scroll Through the</u> <u>Different Screen Effects</u> 'til you get to the **Balloon Option**, or one you want...
- (Note: You can also <u>Modify</u> the <u>Message Bubble</u> which has 4 <u>Different Types</u> of <u>Message Bubbles</u>: <u>Invisible Ink, Gentle, Loud</u>, and <u>Slam</u>. <u>Choose</u> <u>One</u> of the 4 <u>Bubble Options</u> and <u>Tap</u> on the <u>Blue Arrow</u> to <u>Send</u> your <u>Message</u>.)

How To Take a Screenshot on Your iPhone ...

- 8. Get to the iPhone Screen you Want to Capture ...
 - <u>Simultaneously Press</u> the <u>Sleep/Wake Button</u> on the <u>Right-Hand Side</u>, and the <u>Volume Up Button</u> on the <u>Left Side</u>, and <u>Quickly Release</u> <u>Both Buttons</u> ...
 - When you <u>See</u> the <u>Screen Flash White</u> (and possibly <u>Hear</u> the <u>Camera</u> Shutter), the <u>Screenshot</u> has been <u>Captured</u> and <u>Appears</u> in the <u>Lower Left Section</u> of your <u>iPhone</u> for about <u>5 seconds</u>...
 - If you <u>Immediately Tap</u> on the <u>Thumbnail Image</u>, the <u>Captured Image Appears</u> on <u>Another Screen</u> where you can <u>Resize</u>, <u>Add Comments</u>, <u>Send it Somewhere</u>, <u>Etc.</u> ...
 - When you are Finished, Tap Done and Select your Option from the Pop-Up List ...
 - If you **Don't Tap** the **Lower Left-Hand Thumbnail Image Immediately**, then the **Photo** is **Added Directly** to the **Photos App.**

How to Cut Out an Image from a Photo on iPhone

- 9. Open the Photos App ...
 - Select a Photo you'd like to Cut Out an Image From. (Make sure it's an Image with a Clear Subject that Doesn't Blend into the Background too much.) ...
 - <u>Tap</u> on the <u>Subject</u>, <u>Hold Briefly</u>, and then <u>Release</u>. You will see the <u>Object Outlined</u> in <u>Silver</u>. Then <u>Tap ...</u> <u>Copy</u>, <u>Look Up</u>, <u>Add Sticker</u>, or <u>Share ...</u>
 - You can **Paste** these isolated subjects in **Messages**, **Emails**, **Notes**, and anywhere else you might include a photo. (You **Can't Paste them on top of other photos** without photo editing software, **unless you Make the Images Stickers!**) ...

How to Turn On Flash Notification on iPhone

- 10. Open the Settings App and Tap Accessibilities ...
 - Tap "Audio & Visual" ...
 - Select "LED Flash for Alerts".
 - <u>Tap</u> the Toggle Next to "LED Flash for Alerts" to <u>Enable</u> this Feature ...
 - (By **Default**, the **LED** only **Flashes** if your iPhone **Locked** and the **Ringer** is On.)
 - However, <u>Set</u> these <u>Two Toggles</u>: "Flash when Unlocked" and "Flash in Silent Mode" to <u>Allow ...</u> and you will enable both <u>flashes to also Flash</u>.
