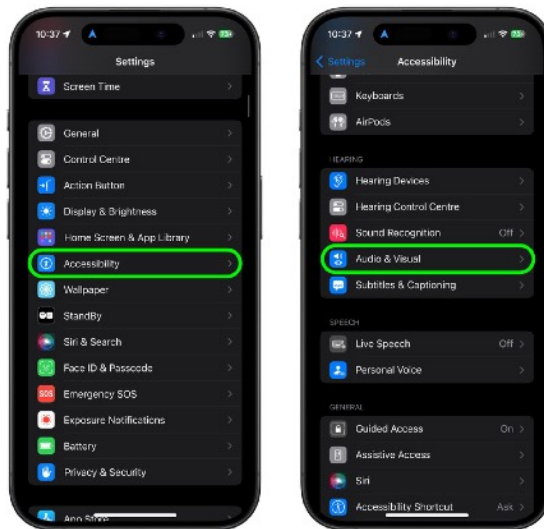


TIPS, TRICKS AND FIXES FOR YOUR APPLE PRODUCTS

How to Enable Background Sounds on iPhone & iPad

Launch the **Settings** app on your iPhone or iPad.

- Tap **Accessibility**.
- Under "Hearing," tap **Audio & Visual**.
- Tap **Background Sounds**, then tap the switch to turn on **Background Sounds** on the next screen.
- Tap **Sound** to choose a sound effect. Choose from **Balanced Noise, Bright Noise, Dark Noise, Ocean, Rain, and Stream**.



Your device will need to download individual sound effects when you play them for the first time, so make sure you have an internet connection, but after that you can play the background sound wherever you are.

Note that the last screen in the steps optionally lets you set the volume of the sound, and includes an additional option to automatically stop the sound when you lock your device.

Adjusting size of your Pointer on a Mac

- Go to the Apple menu and go to "System Preferences"/Settings
- Choose "Accessibility"
- Go to "Display"
- Now adjust the slider next to "Pointer Size" (or cursor size) and you will instantly see the cursor change size
- You can also choose the color you wish

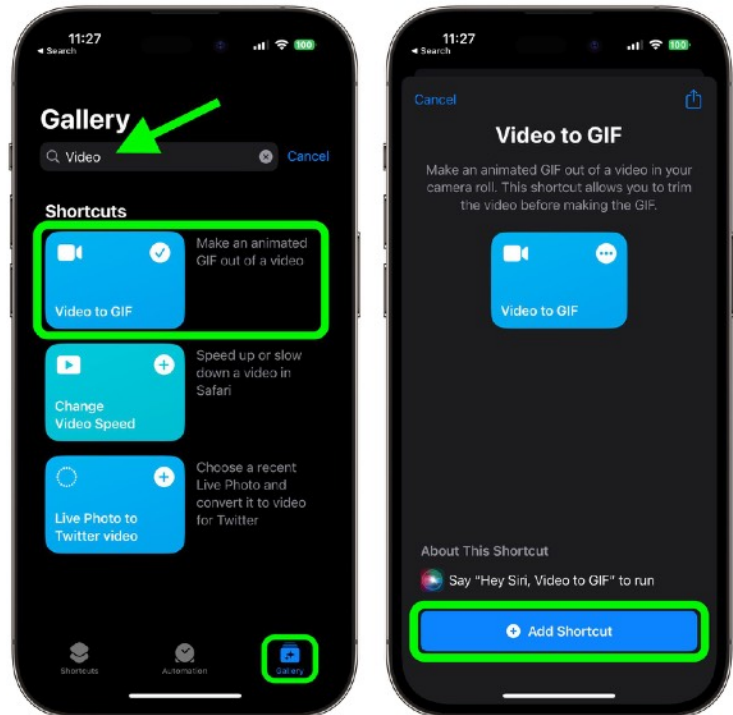

Animated GIFs have become a staple of the internet. Invented in 1987, the looping, soundless video clips can be found everywhere online, from social media networks to messaging platforms. They're often used to express emotions, communicate ideas, or just make people laugh. Because they are so short, GIF files are quick to load and they play automatically, so they communicate what you want instantaneously and without effort on the viewer's part. What's more, thanks to Apple's Shortcuts app, you can turn video clips into GIFs quickly and easily on your iPhone and iPad without even having to download anything.

The following steps show you how it's done.

- Open the Shortcuts app.
- Using the **Gallery** tab, start searching for "Video to GIF," tap the shortcut in the results, then tap **Add Shortcut**.
- Run the shortcut by tapping its card in the **All Shortcuts** tab.
- You'll be presented with a list of videos from your photo library that you can turn into GIFs. Choose the clip that you want to convert.
- If the video is too long, you'll be prompted to trim it down by dragging the chevrons on either end of the clip. After that, tap **Save**.
